Florida's National Marine Sanctuary's newest - and largest - artificial reef the USS Vandenburg, is a retired 522-foot USAF missile-tracking ship used as a troop transport during WWII, for tracking Gemini, Mercury and Apollo spacecraft in the 1960s, and served as the set for the 1999 film *Virus*.

The ship is sunk to the depth of 140', but much of the vessel's massive structure is accessible to divers 40-50 feet beneath the surface.
